The meeting format will be very interactive, with an active contribution from everybody:

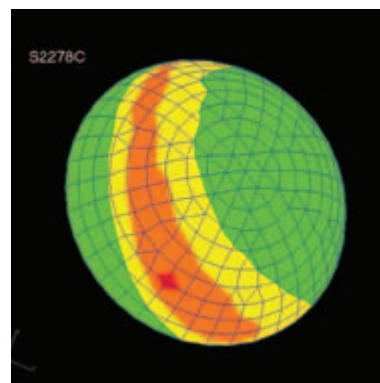

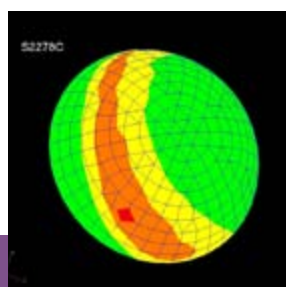

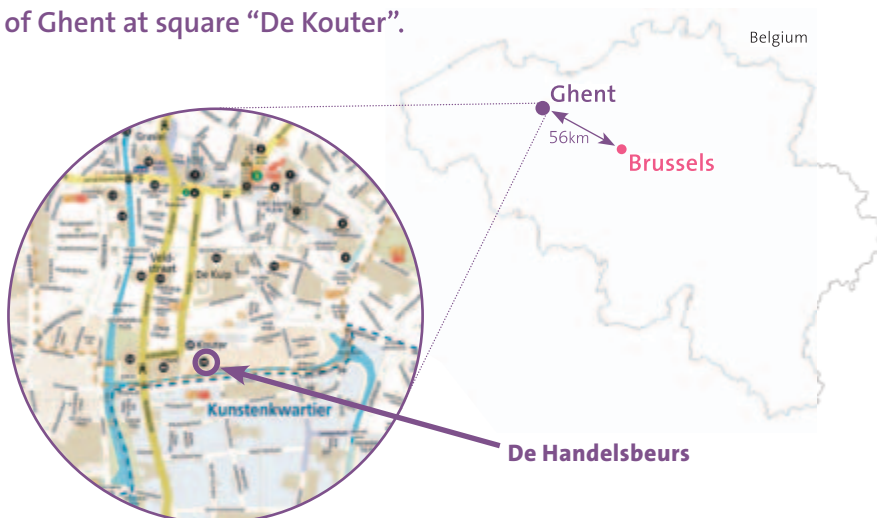
